In this role Lala coordinates and leverages collaboration between Direct Service Agencies, Institutions and Survivor Leaders to create and implement Survivor-Informed and Survivor-Led protocols, policies and programming. Historically, Lala has aided local, state, private and government agencies to advise on best practices when working with victims and Survivors, by way of county trainings, plenaries, workshop panels and keynote presentations.

Lala has trained a multitude of disciplines including law enforcement, government officials, social service agencies, medical personnel, private agencies and school personnel in many states around the country.
