Edmund Burke once said, "the only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing." A few years ago we saw an evil we could not unsee--child trafficking. When we realized hundreds of thousands of American children are trafficked across the U.S. each year, we refused to do nothing.

To increase victim identification above 1%, we developed training that equips people to identify and respond to trafficking. This year, 3 new OnWatch modules were launched, as well as our H.O.P.E. Training (Healthcare Observations for the Prevention and Eradication of Human Trafficking Training). To date, we have deployed training to over 200K educators, healthcare workers, businesses, and community members.

Our core mission remains steadfast--increase safe house capacity to protect survivors who have the courage to escape. Since 2020, we have served more than 207 survivors. That's over 207 lives free from trafficking.


But the work didn't stop there. We helped fund qualified safe house programs to get new doors open for survivors to heal. To date, we have helped launch 272 beds in 18 states to support trafficking survivors. Our pipeline of new programs continues to expand as our team deploys mentorship to programs across 23 states,

Now, we are excited to share our 2022 initiative. Through evaluating hundreds of programs, we have seen the deep need to elevate best practices to provide survivors with excellent care. We have heard survivors testify to the impact great programs have on their healing journey, but also the pain caused by subpar programs. With the support of survivors, industry leaders, government officials, and state agencies, Safe House Project will be helping to draft new legislation in Congress.

Our work is not finished until every man, woman, and child being trafficked finds freedom, the highest level of restorative care, and hope for their future. Until that is true, we refuse to do nothing.

This begged the question, what was happening to the approximately 3K children identified each year? That's when our team realized that there were less than 100 beds that offered kids safe housing and care.

Safe House Project's mission is to increase survivor identification beyond one percent through education, provide emergency services and placement to survivors, and ensure every survivor has access to safe housing and holistic care by accelerating safe house capacity and development across America.

Supporting Survivors





I am not sure how I found Safe House, but I am beyond thankful... I had been admitted to the hospital and knew that was my chance to escape. I made the call, not sure what to expect. On the other end of the line was a woman who said, "We will figure this out. We will get you out." With the help of local law enforcement and healthcare professionals, they sent a husband and wife team to help move me in the middle of the night. When I boarded that plane to a safe house, there were still a lot of unknowns. But today, today I have a new job, I am going through a safe house program, and I am receiving the care I so desperately needed.

The Healthcare Observations for the Prevention and Eradication of Trafficking Training, or H.O.P.E Training, is a survivor-informed, trauma-informed, and patient-centered online training that equips all healthcare workers to identify potential human trafficking victims, give support, and offer resources.

SHATTERING THE TRAUMA BOND


Abuse is all I have ever known. I didn't know how to escape from the grips of my trafficker because where the heck was I supposed to go?
My brother was my trafficker.

I didn't know how to leave him...

But the night he tried to kill me, the bond that kept me with him shattered. I fled not knowing where I would go, but thank God I landed at a hospital who knew who to call. They reached out Safe House Project who sent a team in to help me escape. They coordinated the safe retrieval of my IDs, and got me on the next flight out to a safe house far from the hell I had been living.

Safe House Project accelerates safe house development through funding and mentorship.

FUNDING APPROACH

As an organization that mentors and funds programs, as well as serving as a national clearinghouse for survivor placement, Safe House Project is in a unique position to identify gaps in the continuum of care for survivors of human trafficking.

This year, we focused on funding new or expanding safe homes whose efforts would fill critical gaps. This included funding programs serving men, mothers with children, and survivors in states where no restorative care home previously existed.

CERTIFICATION APPROACH

Safe House Certification was developed by industry professionals to elevate survivor care by standardizing the use of best practices. The goal of Certification is to ensure that all survivors receiving restorative care have access to ethical, safe, therapeutic, well-resourced, and sustainable residential programs that are equipped to provide them with the standard of care they deserve.

In addition to better serving survivors, Certification drives innovation, continuous improvement, and collaboration with programs within the movement.

"Daily we see quality programs break the cycle of victimization for trafficking survivors. Certification provides a clear way to evaluate organizations and elevate those meeting best practices, while driving all programs to excellence—reducing re-victimization nationwide. Safe House Certification is a collaborative initiative driven by industry experts including survivors, law enforcement, social workers, health care professionals, mental health professionals, and leading residential programs for trafficking survivors in order to provide survivor care that goes above and beyond a basic industry standard of care."

FINALLY FEELS LIKE HOME

...when I woke up in a foreign country, I was terrified. I couldn't speak the language, all the businesses looked the same. But I had to find help to try and get myself and the other girls trapped in this room with me to safety. Secretly, I sent an email to an organization I had heard about... I gave them all the information I possibly could. The SHP team relayed that information to Homeland Security Investigations, who eventually found me and helped me get back to the U.S. As soon as I touched down, SHP had a team of victim advocates ready to help me get to safety. Now I am in a safe house, receiving care from a team that feels like family. I am learning the true meaning of love. For the first time in my life, I feel like I have a home.

National Standards

Safe House Programs are evaluated on their ability to meet national standards and best practices developed by industry professionals; including survivor consultants, restorative care programs, mental health professionals, physicians, etc.



Survivor Review

Certification is reviewed by trafficking survivors who understand the needs, value, and challenges of restorative care and seek to elevate the national landscape to meet the needs of future survivors.



Continual Improvement

Certification demonstrates an organization's commitment to self-assessment, improving quality of care, and adopting new methodologies to improve the effectiveness of their program.



Community Engagement

Participation in the certification process affirms a commitment to quality, which increases local sustainability, community involvement and volunteerism.

NEW MEMORIES. NEW TRAUMA.

I thought I knew my entire story. I thought I had already done the hard work of processing the trauma. But I started to struggle with my mental health when the new memories started to appear. The floor went out from under me. I was kicked out of my apartment and needed support. I decide to find a transitional program, so I could get my feet back under me. Safe House Project connected me with a program and came alongside me as I adjusted to my new home. Now, I am working full time, have an apartment of my own, and am receiving mental health treatment to work through the new memories of my past.

A REMINDER OF HOPE

Since my escape from my trafficking situation, I've worked hard. Working hard is something I've grown to be extremely proud of because it's one of the many things I was told I would never be capable of doing. I was told I was useless, incapable, stupid, and only suited to use my body to provide for myself and my children. My hard work provided space for me to dream. With each "impossible" task I completed the ceiling of what I was capable of continued to rise to the point where now it seems endless.

Since my escape, my dream has been to use my experiences and hard work to be part of lifting that ceiling for other survivors and supporting the people and organizations promising them a better life.

When I knew I would be leaving my previous job to move across the country and support my daughter, Safe House Project didn't just use their contacts to find me something new, they curated a position especially for me on their staff which utilizes those gifts and talents I had been honing through my hard work. They believed in my calling and abilities and have provided me the space to use them in a way that is making serious change in aftercare programs across the country. I'm viewed as knowledgable, qualified, and deserving of a seat at the table. I'm so excited for what we will do together.
