




Sharon thrives in her role as local Virginia Beach business owner. However, every couple of months, the island calls to her. "I go and visit

Stein: Some players played 15 years ago, took a break and came back to the team. We only had one new player this year. But other years, we have had several new players.


What are your favorite things about playing with your team, or about playing tennis in general?





MAY WE RECOMMEND...



At this time of year, the mild weather and blue skies may be tempting us outside more often. We may enjoy our morning coffee on a porch or walk our dogs in First Landing State Park. And as local or migrating birds fill up on seeds and berries to sustain them in the leaner colder months ahead or the long trek south, we may wonder — what bird did I just hear? Did you know there's an app for that?

The free Merlin Bird ID app for your smartphone, created and operated by the Cornell Lab at Cornell University, not only can identify a picture of a bird that you snap, but it can recognize it just by its song. Merlin uses thousands of recordings to learn the vocalizations of each bird species, and it works anywhere in the world.

Download the free app to your phone, choose the bird pack for your area, and see how quickly your list fills up. You may not be able to see every bird Merlin recognizes, but if a bird is calling out nearby, it will name it. Indeed, it records noise surprisingly well as long as it is close enough for you to hear. After about 10 minutes of recording, the app prompts you to end your session or continue recording.

The photo identification tool allows you to snap an image of a nearby bird to upload or choose from a library of options. You can save bird IDs and just explore the app to learn about birds in your area. The app can currently identify 7,500 species. Within minutes of downloading the app, I recorded and identified the sounds of a house wren, yellow warbler, red-bellied woodpecker, house sparrow, osprey and more — all while enjoying my morning coffee.

If you live in Virginia Beach, you may have had occasion to visit Sentara Virginia Beach General Hospital (SVBGH) as either a guest or a patient. Perhaps you even noticed a sign with an arrow in the main hospital corridor directing you to "Mary's Garden." If you heeded its call, you found a special oasis; and if you have yet to visit, a respite designed to induce relaxation and to memorialize two amazing women awaits.

The garden's name has a dual meaning and is shared by two honorees. One woman provided the inspiration for the garden and another jumpstarted the financial support for its creation. After many lengthy stays in SVBGH, Virginia Beach resident Mary Babb Savage longed for a beautiful place to rest, recharge and build the energy needed to face her next challenge.

"Mary Babb Savage was a dear friend of mine, and she had nowhere to go outside when she was so sick with leukemia," recalled Virginia Beach Garden Club (VBGC) member Jean Marie Randolph. "She was so 'alive,' and this is a great reminder that her death was not for naught." The garden was Randolph's brainchild to honor her friend. "It took a lot of discussion with the hospital, and, with their permission, I was able to make my idea come to fruition," she said.

Honorary VBGC member Mary Hamilton Winder heard about Randolph's idea and allotted money from her estate toward the project. Next, the VBGC donated money to begin the building and planning of the garden. Randolph and her husband raised the remaining funds.

"I can remember going out at night to speak to garden clubs and recreation centers to raise the money," recalled Randolph. "My husband was a banker, and we called on businesses, friends and organizations to reach our final goal." Today, nestled between the hospital proper and the 1080 building is a beautiful, tranquil and private garden aptly named in memoriam for both Marys. Patients, guests, volunteers, hospital staff and even pets are welcome to visit and relax.

The building of Mary's Garden was a notable collaboration. Landscape designer Meg French, a member of the Junior Virginia Beach Garden Club at the time, designed the layout. Randolph designed wrought iron gates featuring a sycamore tree. Local sculptor Matthew Fine designed a central fountain with marble columns salvaged from the Federal Building in Norfolk. It is encircled by four six-foot-long benches handmade



by local furniture designer and maker Jeff Lawson, who incorporated reclaimed angelique wood from the building of the Schooner Virginia.

From concept to construction, it took almost two years to complete Mary's Garden which opened its arched gates on June 5, 2005. Plants were selected for their cool, calming colors and to provide a year-round display of blooms and color. The layout design of flora, bushes and trees held the intention of providing a peaceful atmosphere and a chance for



fresh air to renew mind, body and spirit. Mary's Garden now offers a respite from the confines of hospital walls, and encourages not only peace of mind, but healing and vitality.

"ICU patients have been brought outside by a team of doctors and nurses for their last breath of fresh air with the sun on their faces," explained Randolph. "The Rehabilitation Center uses it daily, weather permitting."

There are now many benches, tables and chairs to accommodate all who wish to rest among the garden's charm — there is even a child-sized table with chairs. Randolph said, "It is not unusual to see a doctor out in the garden







with their feet up on the table and their eyes closed, resting between surgeries, or a doctor with a family huddled together trying to make a final decision for a loved one."

This beautiful "healing" garden exists as a special place for all who wish to visit. However, nature still benefits from nurture. While it exists under the umbrella and blessing of SVBGH, Mary's Garden is maintained and funded separately by Mary's Garden, Inc. and runs on donations from the public.

Q: What does "White Christmas" mean to you?


[JD] "Since I have spent Christmases without my husband while he served overseas, I appreciate the celebration of togetherness and love that this classic musical showcases."

SAFE HOUSE PROJECT EFFECTIVELY COMBATS HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN VIRGINIA By Gina Foresta

"Thank you for believing me and helping me when everyone else said no. It's because of you I am alive. It is because of you, I am free," — Summer, Trafficking Survivor

The trafficking of humans is considered the second largest criminal industry in the world, surpassed only by drug trafficking. While human trafficking reaps an estimated \$32 billion yearly, it is considered a hidden crime. In 2018, the Department of State listed the United States as one of the top three nations in the world for human trafficking offenses. According to the Counter Trafficking Data Collaborative, over 70 percent of identified trafficking victims are Americans being bought and sold by other Americans.

Humans are trafficked for a variety of purposes in which a third party individual profits based on the exploitation of another individual. Alia Dewees, survivor of domestic minor trafficking and now the director of aftercare development for Safe House Project said, "Buyers of adult media content in the United States are the largest drivers of demand globally, and the highest levels of this media that involve children are produced in this country to sell around the world. As a survivor of domestic minor trafficking, I believe it is critical that we understand how this is affecting vulnerable individuals in our communities, but more importantly, how we can work to protect them and prevent the spread of trafficking." Human trafficking affects every race, gender and socioeconomic class. Traffickers prey on vulnerable individuals and exploit those vulnerabilities to coerce them into trafficking.

Virginia Beach resident and military spouse Brittany Dunn lived just outside Reno, NV before she moved to Virginia Beach. "Brothels were legal there, and it was reported that people were being trafficked through the brothels and at massive local events, like Burning Man," she recalled. When she moved to Virginia Beach, she met two other military spouses who shared her concern. Kristi Wells saw human trafficking while she was on a missions trip in Costa Rica in tent cities where children as young as 5 years old were being sold to tourists. Vicki Tinnel witnessed it on the streets of Atlanta, GA prior to moving to Virginia Beach. "When we learned that hundreds of thousands of Americans are trafficked every year and that Virginia is 15th in the nation, our hearts were broken," explained Dunn. "Vulnerable boys, girls, women and men, from very young children to the elderly, were trafficked in our own community, and only one percent of those being victimized were ever identified."

As mothers, the three women felt a strong urge to respond. With seven children under the age of 7 years old between them and three deployed spouses, they found time to learn as much as they could about the antitrafficking cause. "We researched what was being done well, determined what needed to be improved, and identified what strengths we had to use for service to tackle this complex issue," said Dunn.

They launched the Safe House Project in 2017. "Our mission is to increase survivor identification beyond one percent through education, provide emergency services and placement to survivors, and ensure every survivor has access to restorative services in a safe house," said Dunn. "By leaning into a vision beyond our resources, a commitment to serving survivors with excellence, and empowering others to be part of the solution, we have seen incredible steps taken towards eradication."

To date, Safe House Project has trained over 250,000 people to spot, report and prevent trafficking. The project has provided emergency services and safe house placement to over 270 survivors, and helped launch 272 new beds in safe house programs. Safe House Project also regularly educates policymakers on effective legislation to support survivors at the state and federal level.



Over the past five years, Dunn, Wells and Tinnel have learned that they can do what they love — serving and empowering others, providing education, finding strategic solutions, and advocating for change - to fight something that they abhor. "It is the survivors who inspire us to get up each morning and keep going, because they are worth every investment of our time, talent and treasure," emphasized Dunn. "But no matter how big those numbers get, our team always comes back to the fact that every number



has a name, and every name has a story, and we are grateful to be a small part of their healing story."

A survivor, Lily, recently said, "When I called Safe House Project they heard me. They actually listened to my story. They believed me. And even after they knew what had been done to me, they still looked at me like I was a person. They still looked at me with compassion in their eyes."

The training and education offered by Safe House Project provides effective results. One volunteer reported, "I just wanted to share an experience I had last week, and, because of your training, I knew what to do. After attending a movie, I went to get gas for the long ride home. I noted an older gentleman with a young child walking through the parking lot late at night. I noted he was dressed appropriately for the warm weather, while the child had on a parka, and they were headed toward a motel. My gut immediately felt uneasy, but by the time I stopped pumping gas, they were gone. I contacted the local authorities, and long story short, they provided me with an update this morning that the officers investigated and rescued a little boy who was being trafficked."

Dunn added, "This is one story that shows the power of understanding this complex issue, and how, when we each have our eyes opened, we can be part of the solution."





Here are three simple ways you can engage:

- 1. Increase Survivor Identification: Educate yourself on how to properly identify and report suspected trafficking take our free one-hour OnWatch training at IAmOnWatch.org.
- 2. Provide Emergency Support: Support survivors who are exiting their trafficking situation with emergency services by signing up as a monthly "Forty for Freedom" at www.safehouseproject.org. Your support is critical to helping us safely exit a survivor from their trafficking situation, provide emergency support services, housing, food and basic necessities. When our survivor response team steps into their world, we speak life into a survivor reminding them that they have value, dignity and worth as a human being and that we want to see their dreams restored.
- 3. Engage: Volunteer as part of our Hampton Roads Leadership Team.

In addition, trees planted in the fall require a lot less water as they get established and can often get enough through natural weather patterns. Some of the best local trees to plant in our area include White Fringe, Red Maple, River Birch, Sweetly Magnolia, Sourwood, Eastern Redbud and Black Cherry.

Making your own bitters is easy, but does involve a few unusual ingredients. Visit sites online, such as mountainroseherbs.com, to find them easily. This recipe requires three weeks of steeping. Begin soon, and have homemade bitters in time for the holiday season. The bitters can be sipped on its own or used in any recipe calling for bitters.

Ingredients:

- Zest from four to five oranges, any type will do
- 2 star anise
- 1 teaspoon anise seeds
- 1/2 teaspoon dried burdock root
- 1/2 teaspoon dried gentian root
- 1/2 teaspoon dried juniper berries
- 1/2 teaspoon dried coriander seeds
- 1/4 teaspoon dried sassafras root pieces
- 2 cups Tarnished Truth or Chesapeake Bay Distillery vodka
- 1 cup filtered water
- 2 tablespoons local honey

Directions:

- 1. Add the orange zest and all herbs to a quart size mason jar. Cover with vodka, and seal with a lid. Place the jar in a cool, dark place, such as a cabinet or pantry, and shake it a few times over the course of three weeks to combine.
- 2. After the three weeks, place cheesecloth over a bowl to strain the contents of the jar. Rinse out the jar, and pour the strained liquid back into it.
- 3. Add the water to a small saucepan, and bring to a boil. Remove from the heat, and add the honey. Stir to dissolve the honey, and cool to room temperature. Pour the honey simple syrup into the strained vodka, reseal the jar, and shake to combine.
- 4. Allow the infusion to steep for another two days. Any remaining sediment will settle to the bottom of the jar. After the two days, carefully pour or ladle the liquid into a clean bottle, avoiding the sediment. Enjoy!

To fill the void created by the lack of social interaction during the COVID shutdown, many teens began volunteering at their local libraries. Not only does volunteering connect them to other teens, but the work builds intrapersonal skills and a better understanding of their community. They have engaged in numerous activities and have gained a strong appreciation for their library's contribution to the community. "Volunteering for TAG has opened my eyes to how important libraries are to a community and how underutilized they are," Mollie said. During their time in TAG, Mollie and Aiden have planned and hosted events alongside their peers and library staff. For example, during Teen Times,



Mollie and Aiden teach and facilitate fun activities with participants. During a Harry Potter-themed event day, Mollie dressed up as a character and played fun games with other teens. Their favorite activity by far, however, was a series of murder mystery nights, in which they created a story line and planned clues. It was a fun way for them to get creative and see where their imagination could take them.

Through working under different TAG leaders, with multiple other teen advocates and teen library program participants, and by witnessing the growth of their peers, seniors Mollie and Aiden will graduate high school knowing they were able to make a difference in their local community. Aiden said, "Volunteering through TAG has helped me open up to others my age and has helped me find a new way to help my community through my library."

The Virginia Beach Public Libraries are always looking for new volunteers to participate in TAG groups. It is a great way to get service hours and is a valuable addition to college applications.
