

SEX TRAFFICKING AMP MODEL

Sex trafficking is the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for the purposes of a commercial sex act, in which the commercial sex act is induced by force, fraud, or coercion (22 USC § 7102).

Individuals under the age of 18 are considered to be victims of sex trafficking, regardless of the use of force, fraud, or coercion.

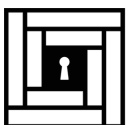
The Action-Means-Purpose (AMP) Model illustrates the federal definition of a "victim of severe forms of trafficking in persons."

Trafficking refers to when a trafficker takes any one of the noted **ACTIONS**, and then uses the **MEANS** of force, fraud or coercion for the **PURPOSE** of pressuring the victim to provide a commercial sex act. One from each element must be present to indicate that the victim has not consented based on free will.

Once again, any time a child is used for commercial sex, they are a victim of child sex trafficking, regardless of whether induced by force, fraud, or coercion.
